	Edmund expressed his concerns with the sewer issues they are experiencing. This past weekend they were unable to flush toilets or drain sinks as the water would come back in his drains. They installed a bigger pump a few years back. But now we are having problems again.
	This residence is located level with the sewer lines. When we experience heavy rains it impacts them greatly, their back water valves close up and they are unable to flush toilets, drain water. This was identified in 2014. The Town replaced the old lift stations which contained overflows. When the sewer lines were overloaded the overflow at the lift station was opened up and flowed into the ocean to alleviate the pressure on the lines. The Department of Environment no longer approved these types of overflows of the lift stations and therefore they were blocked off. But this ended up creating issues for this residence. Council consulted with Engineers to see what the options were. A new overflow could have been installed, quote from engineers came in over \$150,000, or a bigger pump could be installed in the lift stations to help resolve the problem. Council installed bigger pumps and to our knowledge it had resolved the problem until this past weekend. There was some discussion about increasing the pump size again, but uncertainty if that would help as the force main size can only handle so much.
	Council agrees to reach out to Municipal Affairs and Department of Health to try a find a solution.
