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	Fire Hall Extension Project – Kick –off call and site visit with the engineers went well. The timeline and importance of getting this project completed this year was discussed. The engineers are prepared to roll this project out this summer. They came and completed measurements and will design drawings for review. Tight budget was discussed. They will get pricing for items and we will follow budget closely, there may have to be a few items that we purchase at a later time if the funding does not allow. Ie. lockers Town Hall Project Update – Project is moving along well, all items to date have been purchased. Financial overview was sent out previously by email.
