water and/or low water pressure. As a result of this flushing, the entire
Town will be placed on a PRECAUTIONARY BOIL ORDER
until further notice.

Backyard Fires

With the warmer temperatures and longer days there has been an increase in backyard fires.

Some things to consider while having a fire:

Keep your neighbours in mind - fire pits can cause adverse health effects in some people.

Refrain from burning household garbage, plastics, hazardous materials, etc.
Only untreated wood should be used for backyard fires.

Be vigilant of wind speed, direction of the smoke, and the size of the fire.

NEVER LEAVE A FIRE UNATTENDED.

Tax Deadline

June 30, 2021

Unfortunately, after this deadline, any overdue accounts will have their services discontinued and further action will be taken to collect any outstanding arrears.

There will be no exceptions to this deadline.

Animal Control

An Animal Control officer will continue to conduct monthly visits to our Town looking for animals not tethered or penned. Fee for release of impounded animal - \$50.00.

General Repair Permits

No person shall carry out any development within the Planning Area unless a permit for development has been issued by the Town of Norris Point.

Failure to obtain a general repairs permit will result in a fine. The cost of the permit and a fine (equivalent to the original permit cost) will be billed to the residents account.

Illegal Dumping

We have been experiencing an increase in illegal dumping within our town.

Illegal dumping is a serious and unnecessary problem that poses a threat to the environment and our communities. Dumping waste in unauthorized areas can pollute the land and water, negatively impact wildlife and result in significant clean-up costs. Fines for illegal dumping can be from \$500 - \$10,000.

It is disappointing to see this happening within our town as the majority of the items that are being dumped can be brought to the Long Range Transfer Site for free of charge. These areas will be monitored, reported, and further action will be taken.
