



### Message from Our Mayor

We are aware of the impact that COVID-19 is having on our community. This is a difficult time for our residents, businesses and organizations. As we know, the information about COVID-19 is evolving regularly. It is important, as we seek to protect ourselves, our loved ones and our community that we are following the guidelines as provided by our Provincial and Federal Government Agencies. As a municipality, we will receive information directly from these agencies and continue to follow their directives.

As a local government our primary function is to ensure continuation of operations and essential services (water, sewer, waste collection, snow clearing, etc.), share verified information with our community, take measures to protect our first responders, and ensure we reduce risk for staff and Councillors. We will continue to consult with local partners to understand the short and long term impacts of this outbreak on their operations, and respond to any requests.

We are pleased to see the extra measures that the local businesses within our communities are taking to protect us and their employees. These measures are important so that they can continue to provide us with these essential services. We encourage everyone to continue taking extra precautions to ensure everyone's safety. The best recommendation to stop any potential spread of the virus is to just **STAY HOME**, only go out for essential items. If you do have to go out please follow the social distancing recommendations. We know this is especially hard during this time of year but we all need to do our part. The extent and impact of COVID-19 is unknown, we can only take it one day at a time and hope that everyone follows the directives of these agencies to ensure everyone's safety.

So please take care of yourself first and foremost and then look out for others in the community. It is still cold and influenza season so if you are sick at all, just stay home if possible. We'll all feel better if you do.
