#### Climate Summit Program

Aim Network is offering an opportunity for the 7 Communities in the Gros Morne region to collaborate together on regional initiatives to adapt to common climate challenges and build climate-resilient infrastructure planning into asset management programs. The cost per municipality would be approx. \$1,900.00. A meeting is scheduled for Thursday September 22 that will provide more details in order for Council to make a decision.

#### Fire Hall Tender

1 bid was received from Brook Construction Inc. and the bid came in quite high, it doesn't include the electrical or mechanical portion of the project. Town Clerk Manager contacted Municipal Affairs for guidance and they advised that there are two options to consider. 1) Cancel tender or 2) ask for an extension and retender on the spring.

Another option that we may be able to entertain is council applying for project management authorization. This is not encouraged however can be completed since it is only a small scale project. Council would continue to use the engineer but would be responsible for getting quotes for materials and putting out tender for contractor or hiring carpenter and labours.

Councillor Reid declared himself a conflict and left the meeting since he is a member of the Fire Department @ 7:34pm.

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### JCP Program Three resumes were received for the project however the applicants did not have any carpentry experience/skills and limited labour experience. Be it resolved that Council agrees to cancel the JCP application that Motion 2022-194 Wheeler/Rumbolt was originally submitted. All in Favor. Carried. (Laing, Rumbolt, Reid. Major, Wheeler, Walsh) Come Home Year Funding During the planning of Come Home Year prior to the Covid Pandemic the previous Council agreed to donate toward the opening ceremonies. They had agreed to pay for finger foods and entertainment. Motion 2022-195 Be it resolved that Council agrees to contribute \$1,500.00 to the Come Home Year Committee for food and entertainment during the opening Reid/Wheeler ceremonies event. All in Favor. Carried. (Laing, Reid, Major, Walsh, Wheeler) Deputy Mayor Rumbolt did not vote as she currently sits on the Come Home Year Committee Correspondence Crown Lands Meeting Discussion Town Clerk Manager & Councillor Tucker attended a zoom meeting to discuss some of the concerns within Town. They were told that Council cannot issue any building permits to residents on the extension of Hiscock's Lane until the road is brought up to standards and passed over to the Town. Town Clerk Manager will speak with Town Planner to get some clarity on what the regulations state around road standards and if this area will be considered under the subdivision regulations. 47 Wild Cove Road -Fishing shed - There have been safety Concerns have been brought forward to Council regarding the fishing shed. There is no clear understanding who owns the shed. Crown Lands advised that there is a new process Council can go through under section 25 in the Municipalities Act. Motion 2022-196 Be it resolved that the Council agrees to engage Crown Lands to Rumbolt/Major move forward with Section 25 of the Municipalities Act to try and determine ownership of a fishing shed located at 47 Wild Cove Road.
